Denton Rotary creates foundation

After several months of research and discussion, the Rotary Club of Denton board of directors has authorized the establishment of a 501(c)(3) non-profit foundation to help with our fundraising activities. Leigh Hilton agreed to help us set up this non-profit at no charge. The club will pay the filing fees which will cost approximately \$100. The board had originally budgeted \$1,000 for this project so this is a significant savings for the club thanks to Leigh.

This non-profit foundation is not intended to compete with our funding of the Rotary International Foundation. Upon investigation, the board found that many local clubs have a non-profit so that people and

companies that donate to their projects can receive a tax deduction for their gifts. Most, if not all, our projects will be funded through the Denton Rotary Foundation.

In order to ensure continuity and to protect the club, the Denton Rotary Club officers and board of directors will also serve in the same capacity for the non-profit. This was recommended by those we consulted in the Rotary International Foundation office. The board will require the same checks and balances on funds that we presently have.

We will continue to support Rotary International projects as we have in the past. In fact, you will see little change in the operation of the club or projects. The main difference will be that those who donate to our projects can receive a tax deduction for their gifts. The board believes this is a great step forward in our fundraising efforts.

Every Rotarian, Every Year lays grant foundation

For the Denton Rotary Nov. 6 meeting, Kimberly Karl is preparing a short video on the Rotary Foundation and Ken Ingram will discuss "Every Rotarian, Every Year," the club goal of having every Rotarian contribute annually to the Rotary Foundation's Annual Programs Fund.

What kind of difference can your contribution make? Your dollars can fund one or more of these programs:

PolioPlus

Your contribution will help Rotary match a \$100 million challenge grant from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. To eradicate polio, Rotarians have mobilized by the hundreds of thousands. They're working to ensure that children are immunized against this crippling disease and that surveillance is strong despite the poor infrastructure, extreme poverty, and civil strife of many countries. Since the PolioPlus program's inception in 1985, more than two billion children have received the oral polio vaccine.

Support is available for eradication efforts in polio-endemic, recently endemic, and high-risk countries, including National Immunization Days, poliovirus transmission monitoring, and other activities.

Humanitarian Grants Program

Humanitarian grants enable Rotarians to support service projects to people in need around the world. Through the Humanitarian Grants Program, Rotarians have received US\$1.6 billion in grant awards since 1947.

- **Disaster Recovery** allows Rotarians to donate money in response to specific disasters. Funds are distributed to local committees to support recovery efforts. The program was created in 2005-06, and the foundation currently administers four disaster recovery accounts: Hurricanes Stan and Wilma (Guatemala and Mexico), Hurricane Wilma (United States), the earthquake in India and Pakistan, and Solidarity in South Asia. Total contributions to the accounts were \$6.4 million.
- **District Simplified Grants** support the service activities of districts locally and abroad. Since this program began

in 2003-04, more than 1,160 grants totaling over \$17 million have been awarded to districts in almost 60 countries.

- **Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) Grants** fund large-scale, two- to four-year projects to improve health, alleviate hunger, or promote human development. Since 1978, more than 280 projects in 75 countries have been funded through The Rotary Foundation at a cost of \$74 million.
- **Matching grants** provide matching funds for the international service projects of Rotary clubs and districts. Since 1965, more than 24,000 matching grant projects in 167 countries have been funded at a cost of more than \$257 million.
- **Volunteer Service Grants** support international travel by qualified Rotarians and their spouses so they can provide a needed service or plan a necessary project in a community. This program began in 2006-07, and more than 200 projects in over 40 countries have been funded at about \$1 million.

Educational Programs

Rotary's educational programs promote international understanding by bringing together people from different countries and cultures.

- **Ambassadorial Scholarships**, the foundation's oldest and best-known program, is the world's largest privately funded international scholarship program. Scholars study in a different country, where they serve as unofficial ambassadors of goodwill. Since 1947, more than 47,000 scholars from 110 countries have received scholarships of more than \$476 million through The Rotary Foundation.

- **Group Study Exchange (GSE)** annual awards are made to paired Rotary districts to cover travel expenses for a team of non-Rotarians from a variety of professions. Rotarian hosts organize a four- to six-week itinerary of vocational, educational, and cultural points of interest. Since 1965, more than 57,000 individuals (almost 12,000 teams) from 100 countries have participated at a cost of more than \$92 million.
- **Rotary Grants for University Teachers** are awarded to university faculty members to teach in a developing nation for 3 to 10 months. Since 1985, more than \$4 million in grants has allowed over 430 teachers to share their expertise with a college or university in a developing country.
- **Rotary World Peace Fellowships** provide sponsorship each year for up to 110 scholars to study at one of the seven Rotary Centers for International Studies in peace and conflict resolution for a master's-level degree.

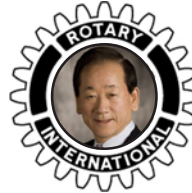

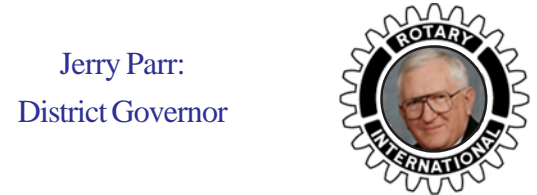
